Bait in Paste Form for Poisoning of Rabbits

Contains 4.5 g/kg-5 g/kg of yellow phosphorus in the form of a paste.

Toxic. Harmful or fatal if swallowed. Ingestion can damage internal organs. May cause skin and eye irritation. Avoid skin and eye contact. When handling open containers or laying paste, wear protective equipment as shown in precautions below. Toxic to terrestrial vertebrates. Take measures to reduce the risk of non-target animals being exposed to the toxin either through eating baits or by scavenging the carcasses of poisoned animals.

Ecotoxic. Harmful to aquatic organisms. Do not lay baits where they may enter waterways. Avoid pollution of any water supply with paste or used container.

Precautions. When handling open containers or laying baits wear overalls and impervious rubber or PVC gloves. Do not eat, drink or smoke when using the product or handling open containers. Wash protective clothing and equipment daily after work. Remove protective clothing and wash hands and exposed skin thoroughly before meals and after any contact. Thoroughly wash implements and bait laying equipment before removing them from the operational area.

Storage. Store in original container, tightly closed, under lock and key and away from feed or foodstuffs. Keep out of reach of children. This product must always be under the control of an approved handler who holds a current test certificate endorsed for class 6 and class 9 substances.

Symptoms of poisoning. Burns on the throat and mouth followed by nausea, vomiting, diarrhoea and garlic-like odour of breath. Symptoms may cease for 1-2 days then return.

First Aid. Act immediately if poisoning is suspected. DO NOT induce vomiting. Call a doctor or emergency physician at your nearest hospital immediately. Directions for use: For best results, lay non-toxic paste over 2-3 nights on overturned earth sods which will attract rabbits. On the final night apply 2 gram-5 gram baits on freshly turned earth sods within close proximity to the previously turned sod. Baits spacing will vary according to rabbit density and habitat. Always turn sods back and bury or remove baits at the end of the operation.

Legal obligations: This product must be sold only to or used by a person holding a Controlled Substances Licence issued by a test certifier who has been approved. Additional permissions may be required depending on method of use and location of use. Signs must be erected at every normal point of entry to the place where the substance is to be applied. Signs must remain for no less than 1 month after the last baits are laid and until baits are removed or destroyed. This product must only be used as specified in the label.

Livestock: It is extremely important to prevent access to baits by domestic livestock and pets. Stock must be kept off the treatment area until baits have been washed out by rain, removed or destroyed.

Spillage: In the event of major spills, inform the Fire Service immediately, and then local health protection officers at your District Health Board or hospital. Isolate the spill area and exclude all bystanders. Take all practicable steps to manage any harmful effects of a spillage including preventing paste from entering streams or waterways. Scoop spilled paste into secure containers. Recover any undamaged paste for later use by placing in appropriately labelled containers and dispose of spoiled paste as directed below. Wash down the spill area with copious water only after all recoverable spilled paste has been removed.

Disposal: The best means of disposal is to use the product for its intended purpose. Product which is surplus or spoiled should be disposed of by burying in a secure site at a suitable landfill, by processing via a sewage treatment plant or treating through a chemical treatment facility. Empty tubes should be buried in a suitable location at a depth of at least 60 cm. Do not use the empty container for any other purpose.

Tracking: It is a legal requirement that this product is tracked using the unique pack identifiers for its full lifecycle, including date, location of its use or means of disposal.

Shelf life: Use the paste before the expiry date shown on sticker below. Any product held after the expiry date shown on the container should be disposed of according to label directions.

Conditions of sale: As no control can be exercised over the methods or conditions under which this product is used, no responsibility or claim, other than those required by statute, will be accepted for any damage or injury whatsoever arising from the storage, handling, application, use or disposal of this product.
